

Walk Number B1

BIDDENDEN



Explore Map 137

Distance – Aprox 2 miles

Time to complete – Aprox. 1 hr 15 minutes.

Dog friendly walk

Free Parking in public car park opposite Red Lion Pub

This walk starts in the village of Biddenden which is situated at the junction of the A274 and the A262 about a 15 minute drive from Broadhembry Camp site.

This walk is fairly flat through out but can be very muddy during wet whether. There are a number of stiles along the route which will require climbing. For dog owners these can be a bit of a problem; however previous walkers have created gaps in the wire that will allow all but the largest dogs to get through.

Walk Number B1 – BIDDENDEN



From the car park walk towards the church, through the lichgate. Take the path to the right of the church and continue until you reach a green lamppost where you should turn right.

Follow the path and continue across a patch of green until you get to the end of the cul-de-sac. Continue on concrete path.



When the houses on the left end continue along the right hand edge of the meadow. Continue over the next three fields crossing a number of stiles along the way until you come to a large pond on your right.



Go past the pond on your right and cross the stile. Having crossed the stile bear slightly left crossing the field and aiming 25 yards to the left of the telegraph pole.

Walk Number B1 – BIDDENDEN



Go through a gap in the trees and cross a plank bridge. Continue along the right edge of the next field to a small pond.
Turn sharp left and continue along the top of the field and the next one. Look for a marker in the hedge on the right. At the marker turn sharp left.



Head to the far end of the meadow and go through a gap in the tall hedge and cross the stream. Turn diagonally left and head for the roofs of the houses in the distance. Leave the field where there is a gap in the hedge. Look for a pond on your right and go over the stile. Continue forward aiming for the church and the end of the walk.

Note: - Please follow the country code and ensure all gates are left closed and that dogs are kept on leads where farm animals are around.

When walking it is the walkers' responsibility to ensure they stay on public rights of way.
